Toy safety

"I would hate for any other child to go through what I have suffered because of buying dangerous toys via online marketplaces."

Remember your children also cannot report from a toy.

Toys from reputable brands are made to be safe. But if they've come from an unknown seller on an online marketplace, a market or small discount store, they could be dangerous.

Buying safely

- Buy toys from brand name producers if you've never heard of the seller or the brand and you're really buying a specialist toy.
- Watch out for cheap copies of popular toys. They may contain hidden or ill-fitting materials.
- Check if the toy has been recalled from sale because its safety might be at risk.
- Play for something that looks smooth, has no sharp edges and no small parts.

Under 10 most at risk

Below 10 children are curious and naturally put everything in their mouths. So dangerous toys can pose the biggest risk to small children. Be especially careful when buying for under 10.

Check out for warning labels and age warnings. If they're present on the product, that's a good sign. If not, for safety check on, pick something else.

Checking toys

If you're unsure about the safety of a toy, here are some things you can do:

- Check the manufacturer's website for recalls.
- Check the toy's age warning.
- Check the toy's safety warnings.

- Check if there are any age restrictions or safety warnings on the product.


